

What are Quantifiers?

Quantifiers are words we use to tell **how much** or **how many** of something there is. They answer questions like:

- *How many?*
 - *How much?*
-



Common Quantifiers for Grade 4

- **Some** → I have **some** books.
 - **Any** → Do you have **any** pencils?
 - **Much** → There isn't **much** sugar in the jar.
 - **Many** → How **many** apples are in the basket?
 - **A lot of / lots of** → She has **a lot of** friends.
 - **Few** → There are **few** chairs in the room.
 - **Little** → There is **little** water in the glass.
 - **All** → **All** the students are here.
 - **Every** → **Every** child got a balloon.
 - **Both** → I like **both** cakes.

Examples

1. There are **many** stars in the sky.
 2. I don't have **any** homework today.
 3. He drank **a lot of** milk.
 4. **Every** student must do the homework.
 5. We have **some** oranges in the basket.
